Sow or transplant in November for Spring harvest:

fava beans
beets
broccoli
Brussels sprouts
cabbage
chard
coriander (cilantro)
garlic
kale
kohlrabi
leeks
lettuce (especially romaine, small-heading bibb and buttercrunch types)
mustards
green and bulb onions
parsley (flat-leaf)
peas
radishes
spinach (especially curley-leafed savoy types)

Transplant in November:

strawberries

Sow or transplant in November:

alyssums
Japanese anemone
baby's breath (gypsophila)
bachelor's buttons (cornflower)
bleeding heart
calendula
campanula (canerbury bells, bellflower)
candytuft
columbine
coralbell
coreopsis
cyclamen
gazania
English and Shasta daisies
delphinium
dianthus (carnation, pinks, sweet William)
forget-me-not
foxgloves
gaillardia
hollyhock
larkspur
linaria
lunaria (honesty, money plant, silver dollar plant)
lupine
ornamental cabbage and kale
penstemon
phlox
California, Iceland and Shirley poppies
primroses (primula)
rudbeckias (coneflower, gloriosa daisy, black-eyed-Susan)
snapdragon
stock
sweet peas
violas (Johnny-jump-ups, pansy violet)
wildflowers

Plant chilled bulbs in November for Spring bloom, primarily:

crocuses
hyacinthis
tulips

Plant winter-color annuals, in November, above spring and summer blooming bulbs for instant and long-lasting color:

calendulas
pansies
Iceland poppies
primroses
violas
