

4-H Policy Reminder:

Youth Protection Interaction with 4-H Members During 4-H Activities Ch. 11, IV., C.

When planning 4-H events and activities, the expectation is always that a minimum of 2 approved 4-H Adult Volunteers will be present.

Only in the event that an appointed 4-H Adult Volunteer has had an urgent matter, and it then becomes impractical or impossible for a minimum of 2 appointed adult volunteers to be present for the 4-H



event or activity, would staff then coordinate and designate another adult at least 21 years old to participate. Use of a non-appointed adult to fulfill these roles is to be done as a *last* resort, not the standard approach for staff when planning 4-H events and activities.



Junior/Teen Leader Merit Award

Did you do a great job as a Junior or Teen Leader last year? Why not try for a Junior/Teen Leader Merit Award? At the time of the LA County Record Book evaluation, Junior and Teen Leaders may request that their 4-H records be reviewed for consideration for a Junior/Teen Leader Merit Award. To be eligible for this award, your 2022-23 4-H records must include:

- 1. A completed Leadership Development Report (LDR) for being a Junior or Teen Leader in a specific project
- 2. A completed Annual Project Report (APR) for a Leadership Project that was attended.

Signatures requested on the forms are mandatory for award consideration. A member may earn this award only once as a Junior Leader (ages 11, 12, 13) and only once as a Teen Leader (ages 14 and above).

California 2023 Make It With Wool Contest - October 14, 2023 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM

Be a Winner with Wool! Enter the California 2023 Make it with Wool Contest
The California Make It With Wool (MIWW) Contest will be held November 11, 2023 in Contra Costa
County. Winners of the California MIWW contest are eligible to compete in the 2024 National MIWW
Contest being held in Denver, Colorado on January 11-14, 2024.

The competition promotes creativity and the versatility in sewing, knitting, and crocheting using wool fabrics and yarns. Entry deadline is October 14, 2023.

Even though the MIWW contest and the State 4-H Fashion Revue (SFR) are not affiliated, the <u>SFR Make It With Wool category guidelines</u> meet the requirements of the MIWW contest. 4-H members can create one outfit using wool fabrics and enter both contests! Information on the 2024 State 4-H Fashion Revue will be posted soon, but members can get started creating their Make It With Wool entry now to enter in both contests.

2023 Online Workshop Series for 4-H Project Leaders

2023 Online Workshop Series for 4-H Project Leaders - This series is designed to help adult 4-H volunteer educators learn how to plan and facilitate 4-H learning experiences (projects) with young people

in community 4-H club projects, after-school club programs, day camps, special interest (SPIN) clubs, teenagers-as-teachers (teens-as-teachers) programs, and other educational experiences. In the four-part series, 4-H volunteer educators learn about their roles, responsibilities, lesson planning, making learning engaging, working with youth, and effective hands-on learning. Sessions cover content from The UC 4-H Volunteer Educators' Guide: For Volunteers Facilitating 4-H Educational Experiences (published in 2023).

Complete the Series for a certificate and name badge. Complete the full four-part series to earn a certificate and 4-H volunteer name badge. They will be mailed to your UC Cooperative Extension 4-H office in January 2024. Note: In order to receive these incentives, you must have active (approved) 4-H volunteer status, through the 4-H volunteer appointment process, by December 31, 2023.

Higher Education Scholarship applications open until September 11, 2023

We are now accepting applications for <u>higher education scholarships</u>. The candidate for any 4-H scholarship must be:

- A high school graduate, or equivalent who is already enrolled in or accepted to an institution of higher education. Institutions of higher education include accredited vocational schools, colleges or universities.
- Enrolled in the UC 4-H Youth Development Program at the time of high school graduation or equivalent, such as receiving a General Education Diploma (GED)
- Enrolled or planning to enroll in at least half of the full-time course load as defined by the applicant's institution.
- Not older than 25 as of December 31st of the application year.

Applicants may apply for multiple scholarships but are only eligible to receive one scholarship per year. Previous scholarship recipients may reapply.

Los Angeles County 4-H Emerald Star Program


The Emerald Star is an award given to a 4H member for planning and implementing an advanced leadership activity. Emerald Star is separate from any star rank. Emerald Star is not a 4-H rank. It has been designed to encourage members to plan and execute a goal outside the member's Community Club. The Emerald Star is for experienced 4-H members who have been in 4-H for at least two years and are at least 13 years old, as of Dec. 31st of the current program year. Each Emerald Star application will be evaluated for its value to the LA County 4-H Program, value to the community, practicality and feasibility.

<u>2023 Diamond Clover Award</u>—The California Diamond Clover is the highest achievement for which a 4-H youth member and young adult volunteers are recognized. All youth members and young adult volunteer who achieve the requirements are eligible to receive this award.

Awardees receive the California Diamond Clover Pin or Necklace Charm, a certificate and a recognition letter from the 4-H Statewide Director.

Applications are accepted year-round. Applications are reviewed by the 4-H Incentives and Recognition Advisory Committee and awarded quarterly.

The True Leaders: Culture, Power and Justice curriculum was designed to engage youth in critical dialogue and collective action in order to contribute to a more empathetic and just society. Youth have an incredible opportunity to see the world as bigger than themselves. This curriculum offers dynamic opportunities for youth to explore their identities, different cultures, new perspectives, and the histories that have shaped power and privilege within our communities. Youth will engage with peers, adult support systems, and communities to increase the resources and tools they need to advocate for positive community change.
